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## \* Terms & definitions

### (1) Accreditation

Procedure by which authoritative body gives formal recognition that organization is competent to carry out specific tasks.

### (2) Critical interval / Alert interval

Interval of examination results for critical test that indicates an immediate risk to the patient of injury or death.

- Laboratory determines appropriate list of alert test for patients & users

### (3) Competence

- Demonstrated ability to apply knowledge & skills.

### (4) Documented procedure

Specified way to carry out activity or process that is documented, implemented & maintained.

- may be addressed in single document<sup>2020</sup> by more than one document.

⑤ Laboratory director

person with responsibility for & authority over a laboratory.

⑥ Laboratory management

person who direct & manage the activities of a laboratory.

⑦ Nonconformity

- nonfulfillment of a requirement.

⑧ point of care testing (POCT)

Testing performed near or at the site of a patient, with the result leading to possible change in the care of patient.

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### ⑨ postanalytical phase

process following examination including  
review of results,  
Retention & storage of clinical material,  
Sample (cmd waste) disposal,  
Formatting  
Releasing  
Reporting &  
Retention of examination results.

### ⑩. Precalytical phase

- Process starts in chronological order from  
clinician's request & include  
examination request,  
preparation & identification of patient,  
collection of primary sample,  
transportation to & within laboratory,  
end when analytical examination begins.

### ⑪ Turnaround time

- Elapsed time between two specified  
points through pre-examination,  
examination & post-examination processes

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
