

About Us

Government Medical College, Surat And New Civil Hospital, Surat

Government Medical College, Surat and the attached New Civil Hospital, Surat were established in the year 1964 with the primary objectives of imparting medical education and for extending tertiary level care for the community of South Gujarat and surrounding regions. Government Medical College is affiliated to Veer Narmad South Gujarat University. The campus sprawling over an area of 130 acres, now houses the main buildings of Medical College, New Civil Hospital, 3-Dedicated Hospital Buildings for words and OPD, Government Physiotherapy and Nursing Colleges, hostels for students and residential quarters for different categories of staff. At present the college admits 250 students for M.B.B.S. degree course and 230+ seats of Post-graduate degree - diploma courses are also offered in most of the subjects every year. GMC, Surat also provides many paramedical courses.

The New Civil Hospital, Surat was started with 300 beds, which gradually, over fifty years, has grown to the present size and dimensions with teaching-bed capacity of 1200 beds with other 110 beds for ICUs and Special rooms; over and above these.

It caters to the needs of nearly 4000 outdoor patients daily and on an average 150 to 200 patients are admitted as indoor patients every day. There are spacious, well ventilated and furnished general wards and special A.C. rooms. Outdoor patient department is well equipped with computerized Registration counters with token system, with separate windows for senior citizens and disabled, stretcher & wheel-chair bay, drinking water & sanitation facilities with broad-specialty and superspecialty consultation services. The Hospital has its own round the clock Ambulance services with wellequipped ultramodern Ambulance vehicles and 'ICU on Wheels'. To provide the latest Healthcare, Medical Education and Research, Hospital is equipped with most sophisticated, ultramodern and state of the art equipments, instruments & diagnostic services. There are NABL accredited laboratory services for Pathology, Biochemistry and Microbiology as well as NABH accredited Blood bank in Immuno-histology and Blood Transfusion department. Hospital has its own Nursing College and Physiotherapy College. The ART center of this hospital is awarded the Best ART center in the state, serving maximum number of patients with its allied PNC Clinic and STI Clinic. There are many specialized services like Hemophilia center, DOST center, De-addiction center, District Early Intervention Center and many more. Designated sickle cell centre at New Civil Hospital allotted by Health department, Government of India, New Delhi.

Short Overview of 1stYear MBBS Subjects

Anatomy:

Anatomy is the subject concerned with the study of the structure of Human Body. Anatomy is derived from Greek word "Anatome" means "to cut up". Anatomy includes appearance and positions of the various parts, locations & their relationship with other parts of body.

Human Anatomy is broadly studied as:

- 1. Gross Anatomy: Study of structure of Human Body.
- 2. Histology: Microscopic structure of various issues.
- 3. Embryology: Study of development of embryo.

Physiology:

Physiology term is derived from Latin word "Physiologica" which means "Natural Knowledge". Human physiology is the science that deals with the normal functioning of

human body system and its regulation. Various systems including nervous system, muscular system, cardiovascular system, respiratory system, excretory system, endocrine system, gastrointestinal system & reproductive system function in a co-ordinated manner to maintain normal life. Any disturbance in normal physiology leads to disease.

Biochemistry:

Biochemistry deals with molecules of life. As life is made up of molecules, diseases are also caused by misbehaving molecules. You will study relationship between molecules and disease. You will also learn how drugs and other health strategy can streamline molecules and thereby help in removing pain and diseases. You will learn biochemistry through lectures, practical's, case studies and will have comprehensive help for study including college website and Telegram solve your queries instantaneously. The department of Biochemistry, Government Medical College, Surat is committed to quality teaching to undergraduate, post graduate medical students as well as Nursing and Physiotherapy students. The department is also doing outreach activity like teaching laboratory medicine to technical staff of PHC, CHC and district hospitals.

The department runs NABL accredited Clinical laboratory to cater needs of patients of New Civil Hospital Surat.

Community Medicine:

Over the period; medical science has evolved from the supernatural theory to a modern science. The subject Preventive & Social Medicine (PSM) is the relatively newer discipline conceptualized in the early twentieth century. Even after its conception, it has kept on growing and changed. It started as only preventive medicine which was to be applied to healthy people, customarily by actions affecting large population, with primary objective to disease prevention and health promotion. Later on a social medicine which emphasizes the strong relationships between medicine and social science, and deals with more of study of epidemiology and medical care of society came on the surface.

Function of the Institute level Anti-Ragging Committee:

- To hold Orientation Programmes for students.
- To hold Joint sensitization programme and counseling of both freshers and seniors and senior by a Professional counselor
- To hold Joint Orientation Programmes of fresher's and seniors to be addressed by the Principal/Head of Institution and the District Level committee and University.
- Send periodic reports of the action taken report to the District level committee and University.
- The principal or Head of the Institution shall obtain an undertaking from every employee of the institution including teaching and non-teaching members of staff, contarct labour employed in the premises either for running canteen or as watch and ward staff or for cleaning or maintenance of the building/lawns etc. that he/she would report promptly any case of ragging which comes to his/her notice. A provision shall be made in the service rules for issuing certificates of appreciation to such member of the staff who report ragging which will from a part their service record;
- The college canteens and hostel messes are also places where ragging often takes place. The employers/employees of the canteen/mess shall be given necessary instructions to keep strict vigil and to report the incidents o ragging to the college authorities if any;
- Each batch of freshers should be divided into small groups and each such group shall be assigned to a member of the staff. Such staff member of the should interact individually with, each member of the group on a daily basis for ascertaining the problems/difficulties if any faced by the fresher in the institution and extending necessary help. By building up report with each member of the group teachers or other members of the staff would be able to infuse confidence in the freshers and make them feel at home so as to enable them to report incident of ragging or bullying. Each group in-charge shall maintain a diary of his/her interaction with the freshers under his/her charge.
- In the case of freshers admitted of a hostel it shall be the responsibility of the teacher in charge of the group to coordinate with the warden of the hostel and to make surprise visits to the rooms in the hostel where the members of the group lodges.
- Freshers shall be lodged in a separate hostel block, wherever possible and where such facilities are not available, the college/institution shall ensure that senior' access to fresher's accommodation is strictly monitored by wardens, security guards and college staff.
- If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority concerned, the accused student will be given opportunity to explain to explain and if his explanation is not satisfactory the authority would expel him from the institution.
- Any other appropriate steps for prevention of Ragging.

Attendance Rules & Regulations for Undergraduate students

Attendance Policy

Aim

The institution believes in the principle of responsible behavior and committed learning from the students. In several academic studies a strong correlation between attendance in classes and the performance of the student has been found. Therefore, students are expected to maintain full attendance in all courses.

- Students shall be responsible for maintaining a minimum attendance of 75% in theory classes and a minimum attendance of 80% in practical or clinical sessions in all the subjects / courses in an academic year to be eligible to take University examinations. Student shall be responsible for making up any work missed during absence. No extra chance will be given for students with attendance less than eligibility to make up attendance.
- Students shall remain in the hospital / wards / OPDs / OT / Casualty as directed by the supervisory Clinical Departments for the entire period of clinical posting.
- Students shall remain in the laboratories until the supervising faculty members permit exit.
- If a student remains absent from the classes due to illness, family emergency, duty leave or any other unavoidable circumstances, student shall submit leave letter, stating the reason of absence with attached evidence where possible (treating Doctor's certificate in case of illness, attendance certificate in case of duty leave, etc.).
- The student shall get the leave application duly signed by the Dean, and hand over a copy of the leave application with Dean's remarks to Heads of each Department, whose classes were missed.

• In case of duty leave, prior sanction from the Dean and prior intimation to the departments is mandatory.

AS A MEMBER OF THE MEDICAL PROFESSION:

I WILL RESPECT the autonomy and dignity of my patient;

I WILL MAINTAIN the utmost respect for human life;

I WILL NOT PERMIT considerations of age, disease or disability, creed, ethnic origin, gender, nationality, political affiliation, race, sexual orientation, social standing, or any other factor to intervene between my duty and my patient;

- I WILL RESPECT the secrets that are confided in me, even after the patient has died;
- I WILL PRACTISE my profession with conscience and dignity and in accordance with good medical practice;
- I WILL FOSTER the honour and noble traditions of the medical profession;
- I WILL GIVE to my teachers, colleagues, and students the respect and gratitude that is their due;
- I WILL SHARE my medical knowledge for the benefit of the patient and the advancement of healthcare;
- I WILL ATTEND TO my own health, well-being, and abilities in order to provide care of the highest standard;
- I WILL NOT USE my medical knowledge to violate human rights and civil liberties, even under threat;
- I MAKE THESE PROMISES solemnly, freely, and upon my honour.

मैं रोगी या उसके घर से संबधित गोपनीय बातों का प्रचार नहीं करूँगा। मैं मरणासत्र रोगी की विवेचना नहीं करूँगा, क्योंकि वह रोगी या उसके आत्मीयजनों को आघातकारक हो सकती है। मैं अधिकृत विद्वान होते हुए भी अपने ज्ञान की अभिव्यक्ति अहंकार के रूप में नहीं करूँगा, क्योंकि इससे रोगी के स्वजन अपमानित अनुभव कर सकते हैं।
